

Rough Terrain Course

J1 Masted Lift Truck Rider

J3 Telescopic above 9m lift 2/4 steer/articulated Rider

J7 Variable reach/telescopic rotating turret over 9m 2/4 steer Rider

J2 Variable reach/telescopic up to 9m lift 2/4 steer/articulated Rider

J6 Variable reach/telescopic rotating turret below 9m 2/4 steer Rider

J8 Articulated Rider

Our Rough Terrain Course are accredited through ITSSAR and will provide candidates with the basic knowledge and practical skills to operate a Rough Terrain lift truck.

The course will comprise theoretical and practical instruction covering the following:

- Responsibilities under the Health and Safety at Work Act 1974; PUWER 98 and LOLER 98
- Operators Safety Code
- Battery maintenance charging and refuelling procedures
- Pre use checks
- Factors affecting stability
- Motive controls
- Hydraulic controls
- Manoeuvring in open and confined areas and over varying terrain
- Stacking at different levels in open and confined areas
- Destacking with laden and unladen pallets
- Load weight and assessment and load moment indicator
- Safe use of attachments (if applicable)
- Lorry loading and unloading
- Post operative checks

Knowledge:

On completion of training candidates will have gained a theoretical understanding of the following: -

- Responsibilities under the Health and Safety at Work Act 1974, PUWER 98 and LOLER 98
- Operators safety code
- Battery maintenance and refuelling procedures
- Pre use checks
- Factors affecting stability
- Stacking and destacking in open areas and the confined areas and over varying terrain
- Load weight assessment and load moment indicators
- Lorry loading and unloading
- The load handling envelope
- The safe load indicator
- Attachments available in the workplace (if applicable)
- Post operative checks

Skill:

On successful completion of training the candidate will be able to: -

- Drive and operate the lift truck safely and efficiently
- Stack and de-stack loads at various levels in a safe and competent manner in open and confined areas and over varying terrain
- Carry out pre-use checks to ensure the equipment is in a safe condition
- Carry out battery maintenance and refuelling procedures
- Load and unload vehicles
- Operate safely on and over various ground conditions
- Attachments available in the workplace (if applicable)
- Carry out post operative checks

The duration of the course varies depending on the candidate's previous experience from a 1day periodic refresher course, 3 day Experienced operator course to a 5 day novice course for new operators.

On successfully passing the practical skills test candidates will be issued with an ITSSAR accredited certificate and registered on the ITSSAR TOPS database.

Refresher training is recommended every 3 years.
